Return to In-Person Instruction & Continuity of Services Plan 2023-24 School Year

Under the American Rescue Plan: Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief III (ARP: ESSER III) local districts are required to develop and maintain a Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan. This plan outlines and details the district’s plan for a safe return to, or maintenance of, in-person instruction and must include information regarding the district’s implementation of the Center for Disease Control’s (CDC’s) most current guidance at the time of development.

Brighton Area Schools values in-person instruction and has implemented the practices detailed below in order to maintain the in-person learning environment. Adjustments to this plan may be made in response to information learned regarding current and future variants of COVID-19 or other communicable disease and transmission rates in individual buildings, across the district, or if the risk of severe illness, hospitalization, or death increases. If such adjustments are needed, the plan will be shared again for public input. The plan will also be reviewed every six months during the life of the ARP ESSER III grant and updates will be completed if needed. The plan will be shared for public input during those intervals as well. *The district will comply with any and all local, state, and federal mandates/orders.*

Instructional Services	
Continuity of Instructional Services	<p>Elementary and Intermediate (Grades JK - 6): Elementary and intermediate students attend school five full days in-person on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. This mode of instruction will remain in effect for the remainder of the school year.</p> <p>Middle and high School (Grades 7 - 12): Middle high school students attend school five full days in-person on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. This mode of instruction will remain in effect for the remainder of the school year.</p> <p>Families who preferred online learning are given the option to sign up with Michigan Virtual, our 21f courses. These students will remain in virtual learning through the semester. Changes are</p>

These changes were considered providing the switch was supported by the student's Educational Development Plan.</p> <hr/> <p>BAS works to continuously support the wellness of students across the district in junior kindergarten through twelfth grade. Utilizing available grant funds, the district has worked to increase staffing in the areas of counseling and social work. Review and evaluation has been ongoing in this area, as it is a pillar in our strategic plan, and we work to continue to increase staffing in this area.</p>
Health and Safety Protocols	
COVID-19 Testing	Testing will not be required but test kits may be offered to families if provided by the State. Athletic testing will not be required unless mandated by the MHSAA or a local, state, or federal agency and/or a sanctioning body.
Cohorting	Mixing of student groups will be permitted.
Face Coverings	Staff, students, volunteers, and visitors may wish to wear a face covering regardless of the current level of community transmission and are supported in doing so. The District will abide by all laws, lawfully executed orders, regulations, etc. pertaining to facial coverings.
Facilities: Cleaning, Disinfecting, Ventilation	The District will follow regular cleaning and disinfection procedures. Additional cleaning and/or disinfection procedures within a classroom, school, or across the district will be implemented as needed based on local conditions. The District will utilize MERV-13 air filters to improve ventilation in school buildings.
Food Services	Normal food service operations will occur. Additional health and safety protocols may be implemented as required by the Livingston County Health Department.
Hand Hygiene & Respiratory Etiquette	Proper hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette are encouraged and expected. Supplies, including hand sanitizer, will be maintained in order to facilitate proper hand hygiene.
Health Screening & Student Illness	Families are encouraged to conduct a daily wellness check to ensure students are well enough to attend school. Students should not be sent to school when they are ill. A child who has had a fever or is vomiting cannot return to school until they are healthy for 24 hours. Parents/guardians should follow medical professional and/or health

	department guidance regarding exclusion periods for communicable diseases.
Isolation & Quarantine	The District will follow current mandates/orders from federal, state, or local health agencies.
Vaccinations	The District does not require staff or students to be vaccinated against COVID-19.
